Within USDA are the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) which manages the required permit system for unprocessed animal and plant products into the U.S., the Agricultural Marketing Services (AMS) and the National Organic Standards Board (NOSB).

AMS provides a quality grading program for meats, dairy, fruits and vegetables as well as a quality certificate.

NOSB is an advisory board that makes recommendations to the United States Secretary of Agriculture on organic food and products, including review and development of the National List of Approved and Prohibited Substances.
